

SCRUMPTIOUS STAR STITCHERY

**1 day - 6 hour class
All Skill Levels**

This introductory class teaches paper foundation piecing, stars, and flying geese. The pattern, "Tutti Frutti", which includes both the 30.5" octagon and the 39" square with the curved flying geese outer border will be provided.

Students will learn how to create their own freezer paper foundations, how to measure and cut adequately sized pieces of fabric, and how to easily stitch the design,

The list below includes the minimum fabric requirements. I strongly encourage you to bring a larger selection of fabrics to enable more creative freedom and the ability to develop a larger design. As with all quilting projects, choosing good quality fabrics will ensure easier sewing and a more successful finished product. Choose 100% cottons and pre-wash them before class. Hand dyed and hand painted fabrics and batiks, work well for this type of quilt. Think "prints that read as solids" when making your selection. If you are unsure what to bring, bring extra! See you in class!

| 1 yard light background fabric | * Mechanical pencil |
| 1/2 yard outer border and middle star fabric | * Good eraser |
| 1/8 yard inner border fabric | * 6" or 12" Add-a-Quarter ruler |
| 1/3 yard total flying geese fabric (may use several fabrics) | Freezer paper |
| 1/4 yard dark fabric for star points | Fabric and paper scissors |
| 1/8 yard medium fabric for star center | Rotary cutting equipment |
| 1/4 yard of your favorite fabric, a fabric with a theme or color scheme you'd like to feature | Basic sewing supplies |
| | Sewing machine |

*** Specialty tools will be available for purchase in class.**

Classroom Needs:

One iron for every 2-3 students and six foot tables with no more than two students to a table; enough electrical outlets and extension cords to provide power to each sewing machine and iron.
